Introduction

The **purpose** of this documents is to give a summary of training and professional development activities for the year 2019 for the GN4-3 WP1 T5: Human Capital development task (WP1 T5 onwards).

These activities were identified during the annual consultation (**learning needs assessment, LNA**) with the GN4-3 work package leaders, task leaders and participants. The learning needs assessment is a bottom-up inquiry in a form of a discussion when project participants voice out their future plans, knowledge gaps and professional development needs which then inform the activities of WP1 T5.

The WP1 T5 activities are grouped thematically forming three broad categories which are used to structure the contents of this document:

- Technical Knowledge
- Professional Competencies

For WP1 T5 will take this plan into execution and will reach out to those who **requested** the training to start planning. Below, there is an overview of requests by WP.

- impact – in accordance with GLAD requests (feedback, stories, experiences)

Purpose & Impact

Agile software development is an approach to software development under which requirements and solutions evolve through the collaborative effort of self-organizing and cross-functional teams and their customer/end user. It is a focal methodology of organising and managing work within ICT industry and is used extensively for a variety of projects.

As a result of this training, it is expected for the participants (WP5) to develop base-line working processes and language to work efficiently and effectively as a distributed team across locations and multiple projects. As a transferrable skill, this training is also expected to be re-used in other projects and wider NREN operations therefore increasing NREN capabilities and contributing towards sustainability and attractiveness of NREN careers.

Purpose & Impact

T&I is rapidly becoming a core competency of the NREN community; however, there are two key challenges:

- Capabilities are not evenly distributed across NRENs
- There is a high staff turnover that requires efficient onboarding

T&I curriculum project aims to capture the expertise of GN4-3 T&I subject matter experts (SMEs) and make it available to others project members and wider audiences. It is expected

that as a result of this initiative there will be growth in T&I expertise and interest across NREN community, and as result better and wider portfolio of products and services in the area. It is also expected that this project will be one of several initiatives of capturing and showcasing GN4-3 expertise, and in so doing creating the knowledge legacy of the project. These objectives are in line with WP1T5 task of systematizing and capturing community expertise and making it available to wider audiences.

Purpose & Impact

Business Development is a key capability that allows GN4-3 to collect, understand and address the needs of community customers. - validating service requirements

It is expected that this training will deliver products to the market that are in demand yielding higher service uptake. As a field of expertise, Business Development experiences continuous renewal particularly in relation to such topics as customer centricity and route to market strategies, therefore it requires an update and refresher amongst those engaged in this activity.
