Summary per agenda item

Introduction & project management overview

Presenter: Erik Kikkenborg - NORDUnet

On behalf of the Project Coordination team (PCT) Erik presented a high-level overview on the new workplan (May 2019 - May 2020). The main implication of the workplan on the project is a request for an extension of five months. This request has been submitted for comments from the EC Project Officer and will be submitted for approval shortly.

During the preparations of the workplan the deadlines of the deliverables and milestones were revised. The extension should be used for reaching more pilot schools and users, a qualitative and quantitative evaluation of the pilots and measuring the impact of Up2U's learning environment. At the end of the project a sustainable business plan must be presented.

The extension will have implications on the remaining budget. The EC made it clear that however an extension will be granted, no extra budget will be available. This means that the remaining budget must be spread over five extra months. The work package leader have been asked to carefully plan their activities until the end of the project. Based on Q9 financial statements the PCT has calculated expected costs until the end of the project. Reallocation of budget between cost codes within consortium partners as well as reallocation between consortium members will be required to keep within budget and relevant partners have been contacted.

GDPR update

Presenter: Casper Dreef - GÉANT

After update on work done by the GDPR team was provided the General Assembly had a discussion on the implementation of the consent collection tool (KWS).

Discussion outcomes

Consent collection must take place on SSO-level and must roll down to all the tools in the application toolbox. It was considered a risk not having collected consent from parents for minors in situations students have deadlines, e.g. a virtual meeting outside school hours or deadlines for assignments.

As the integration of KWS will take place during the next iterations of the pilots, the other main risk identified was loss of data, especially content created by the users.

The interim solution for consent collections relies on the following actions that are already in place:

- Consent gathered by pilot schools
- Moodle v3.6.2 covers consent collection for all Moodle tools

TF Uniformed content & pilot activities update

Presenter: Antonio Castro de Vieira

The scope of the Task Force is to categorise courses to become reusable for Up2U's users, primarily teachers. There should be 3 different types of courses:

- 1) Internal. For existing pilot countries. The courses will be in national languages.
- 2) Externernal. Open content for new users. In english.
- 3) Tutorial for teachers: how to use this content?

The General Assembly asked the Task Force to define the type of courses that could be defined as uniform courses. A second request was to clean up the courses on the test instance and move them to production instance.

Stabilized SSO and other technical constraints discussion

During this open discussion all attendees had the opportunity to raise technical issues on the Up2U ecosystem. The following issues were identified:

Pilot updates

Presenter: Michal Zimniewicz - PSNC, and the national pilot coordinators

After the presentation the General Assembly discussed how success rates of the existing pilots can be increased based on the success stories.

Three implementation actions were identified as means to improve pilot implementations:

- 1) Badges and certificates for teachers are incentives for teachers and students to finish training and complete courses.
- 2) Offering high quality content.
- 3) Using the platform for other purposes like contests, workshops and one-off events like Olympiads.

Work package 7 was reminded to analyse the success rate of the Continuous Professional Development (CPD) modules. Previously it was identified that a number of teachers drop out of training during or right after CPD module 1. WP7 was asked to analyse why teachers drop out at that stage and report it in its final deliverable.

Sustainability and exploitation

Presenter: Faraz Fatemi Moghaddam - GWDG

Two main sustainable exploitation models have been identified:

- 1) Centralised
 - a) Hosted on the GÉANT network
 - b) This model must be approved by GÉANT's General Assembly
- 2) Decentralised
 - a) Hosted by NRENs
 - b) Funded by local governments and funding bodies



Two more exploitation models were identified during the session:

- 1) CS3MESH4EOSC
- 2) University-as-a-Hub
