



- 2008: First releas of Phaidra
- 2010: Partnership with the University of Padova
- 2010/2011: Hosting for other universties in Austria
- 2012: New architectural design
- 2014: Focus shifed to RDM
- 2018: Promoting Phaidar as Open Source project
- 2020: First Phaidra Con





Why Open Source


- We are promoting open, so we should be open as well

How we do it


- Building networks and be active in different networks
