- Focus on easy and viable solutions
- Less idealisation, more pragmatism
- More trust and self confidence
- Increased collaboration

- Inter-institutional collaboration
- Integration of Safe Exam Browser
- E-assessment as main assessment method

- Disciplinary proceedings due to dishonesty and cheating
- Interest for e-proctored exams is increasing
- Online proctoring not yet fully integrated
- Demand for e-assessment is growing
